

BECOME AN EMT

Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) care for the sick or injured in emergency settings, perform emergent medical services and transport patients to medical facilities. Working as an EMT can be a rewarding job and provides many opportunities for advancement and growth if you want to make it a career.



In order to receive an EMT license, you must successfully complete a formal EMT course and pass a national certification practical and written exam provided by the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT).

Madison Fire Department is offering a course that will provide the training necessary to become certified.

This class will cover how to assess patients, administer medications, and will teach skills such as managing respiratory, medical, trauma, and cardiac emergencies. The program will also provide instruction and practice in how to deal with bleeding, fractures, airway obstruction, emergency childbirth, cardiac arrest, and other common emergencies. Students will additionally learn how to use and maintain common emergency equipment such as AEDs, backboards, suction devices, splints, oxygen delivery systems, and stretchers. Lastly, this course will allow you to spend time on an ambulance and experience how these skills are put to use.

Class # 1 Wed. (Sep 14 – Dec 7) or Thur. (Sep 15 – Dec 8) Nights
Class # 2 Wed. (Jan 4 – Mar 29) or Thur. (Jan 5 – Mar 30) Nights
Class # 3 Wed. (Apr 19 – Jul 12) or Thur. (Apr 20 – Jul 13) Nights

REQUIREMENTS:

- Be at least 16 years of age by the completion of the course.
- Cannot have any felonies on record.
- Must have access to a computer, or tablet, and the internet.
- Must be willing to get, or show proof of, current flu shot and TB test
- Must be fully COVID-19 vaccinated for hospital clinicals. If not, extra ambulance ride-alongs will be provided for clinical experience.

CLASS DESCRIPTION, DATES, AND TIMES:

The class is a hybrid certification course, the equivalent of a one-semester, 6-credit college course. Hybrid means that students will have weekly assignments that are completed online and on their own. The entire class will meet once each week, on either a Wed. or Thu. evening, from 6 pm to 10 pm, to learn practical skills.
